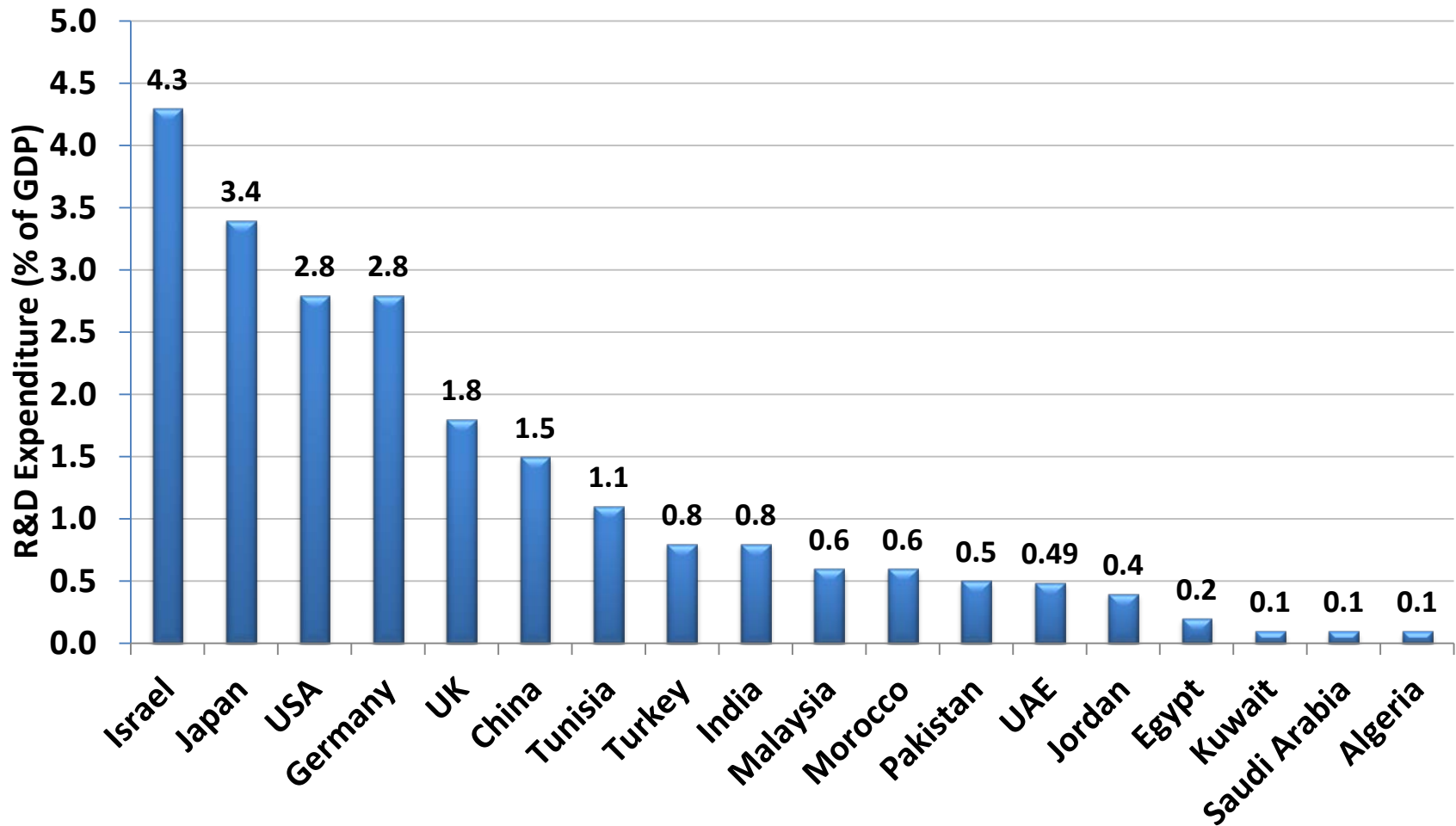

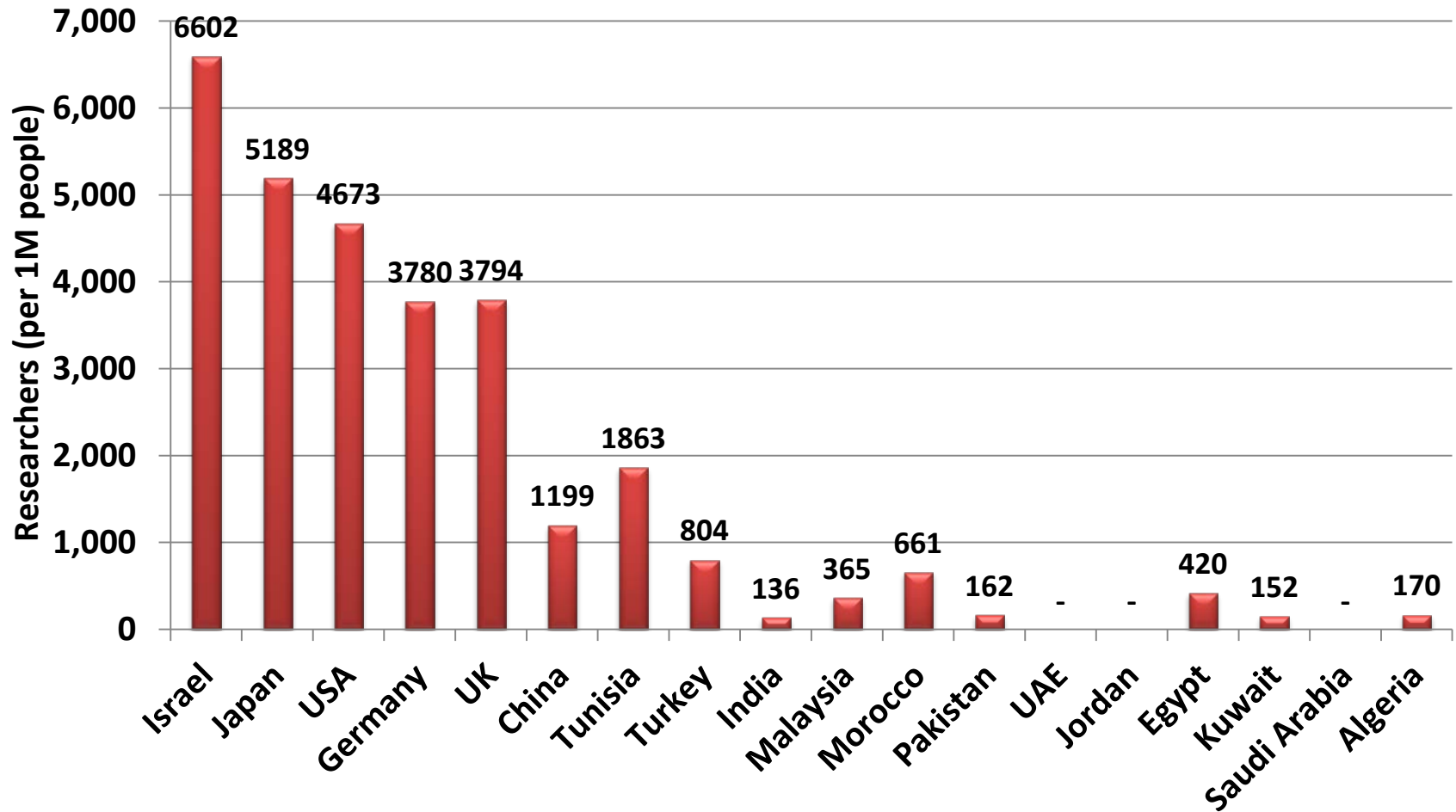
R&D Expenditure (% of GDP) in 2013*

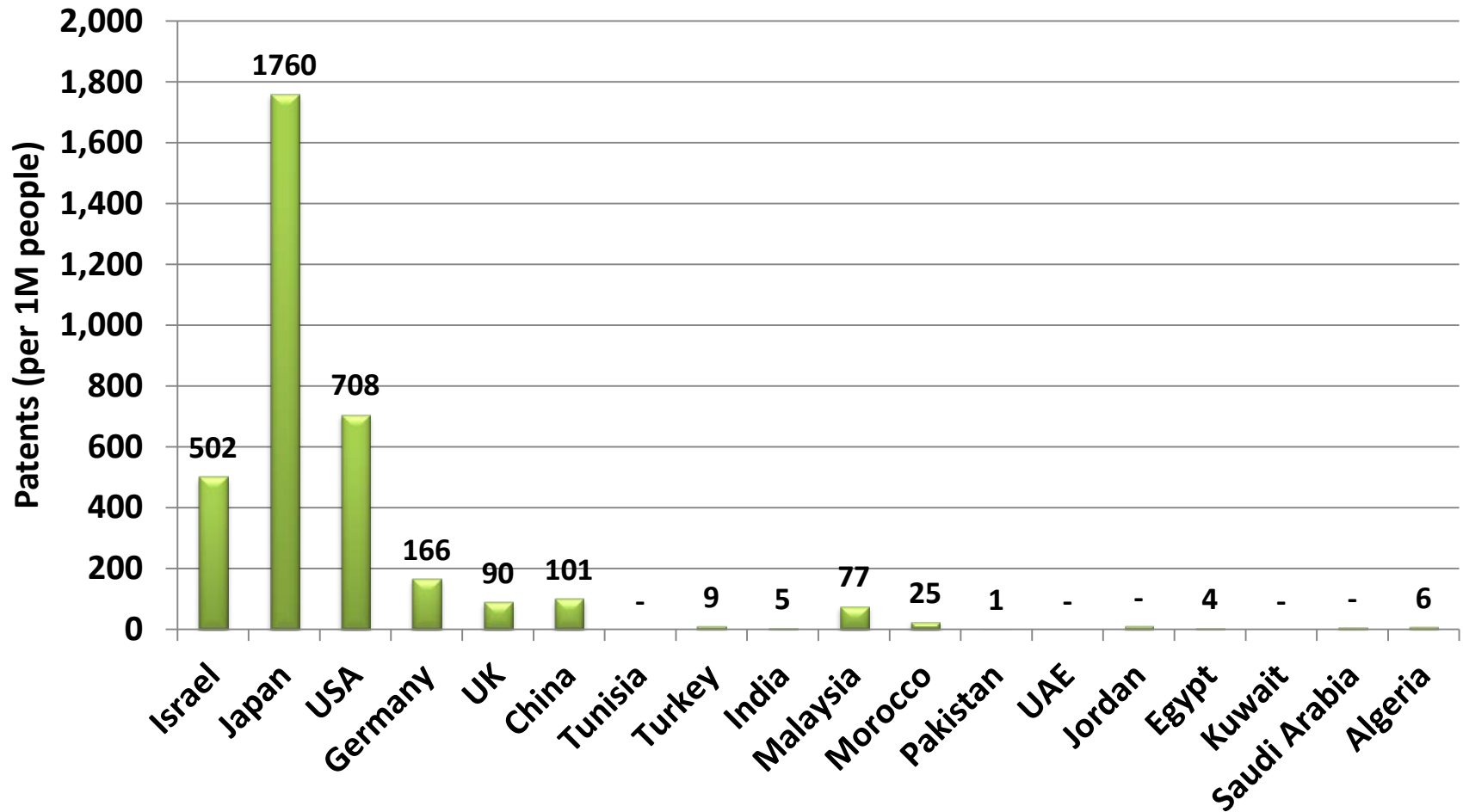
Researchers (per 1M people) in 2013*

We are all familiar with this ...



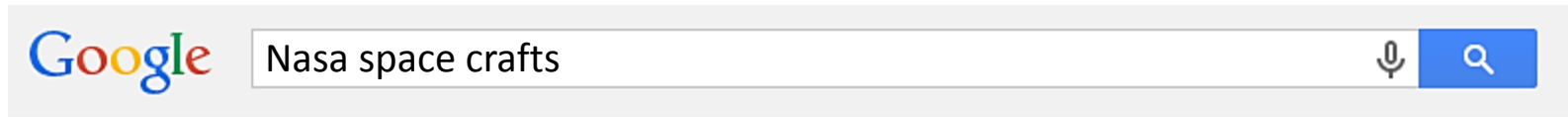
Nasa space crafts



Looking for something ...

... is search, but NOT research!

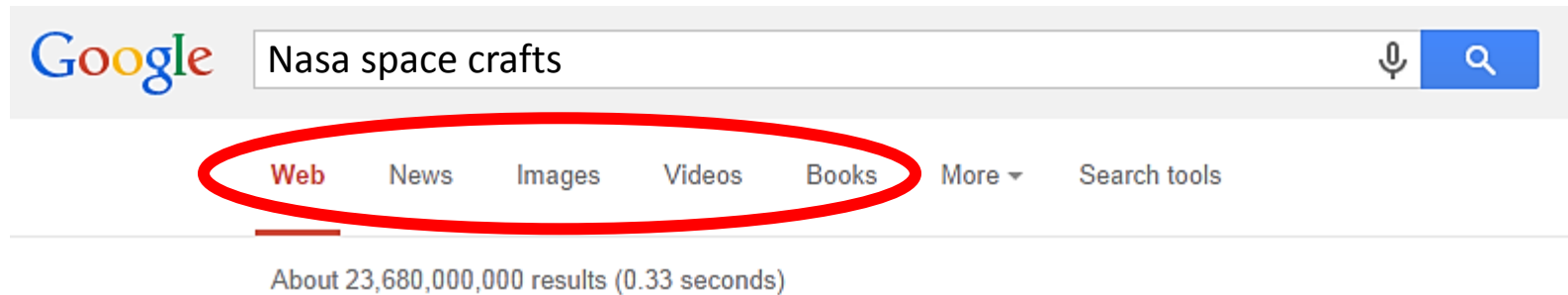
but with lots of results ...



About 23,680,000,000 results (0.33 seconds)

... still search, NOT research!

but with different sources & forms of results ...



... still search, NOT research!

What is NOT research ...

- **Looking** randomly inside different books
- **Downloading** docs from different websites
- **Surfing** the Web
- “**information gathering**”
- Merely **transporting facts** from one resource to another
- **Searching** for data when writing an essay
- **Compiling** facts in written form

Why NOT?

No contribution to knowledge!

***But **search** can be the beginning of the process
that may end in **research*****

What research is ...

*“a search or **investigation** directed to the **discovery** of some fact by careful consideration or study of a subject; a course of critical or **scientific inquiry**.”**

* Oxford English Dictionary

What research is (informally) ...

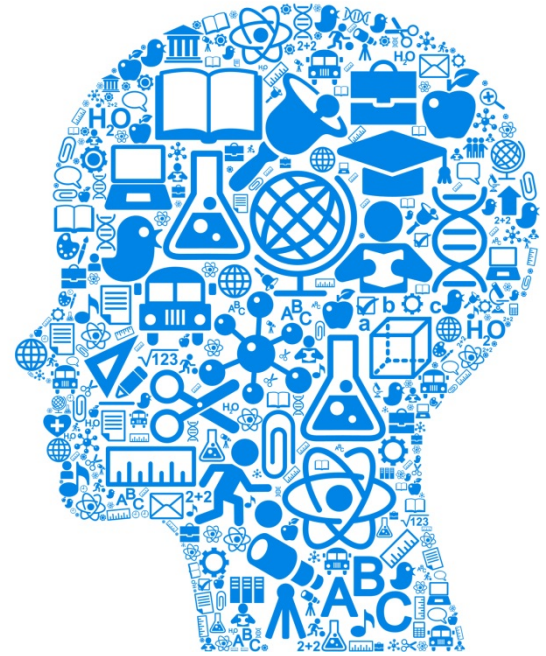
A systematic process of analyzing data (or information) or investigation of things to

- ***establish facts***
- ***reach new conclusions***
- ***increase our knowledge base***
- ***increase understanding of a phenomenon***

Properties of quality research

Critical or **scientific inquiry** is a **formal process**, intended to produce results that are

- incremental
- reliable
- valid
- replicable
- contribute to existing knowledge
- generalizable
- logical
- generating new questions
- intended for the betterment of society



WHY RESEARCH?!

Why is research important?

Guards against the dangers of casual inquiry

- Can guard against the fundamental tendency of people to
 - accept what we hear when presented as facts
 - accept tradition as fact
 - accept authority
 - inaccurate observation
 - overgeneralizations
 - selective observation

Why is research important?

Guards against faults of researchers!

- Can also guard against
 - applications of the misconceptions
 - careless or faulty methods and observations
 - opinions about the way things *should* be
 - ego involvement

Why is research important?

*Provides **solid foundation***

- Important also in ...
 - Discovery and creation of knowledge
 - Theory building
 - Testing, confirmation, revision, refutation of knowledge or theory
 - Investigation of a problem for local decision making
 - Advancements in a discipline or field

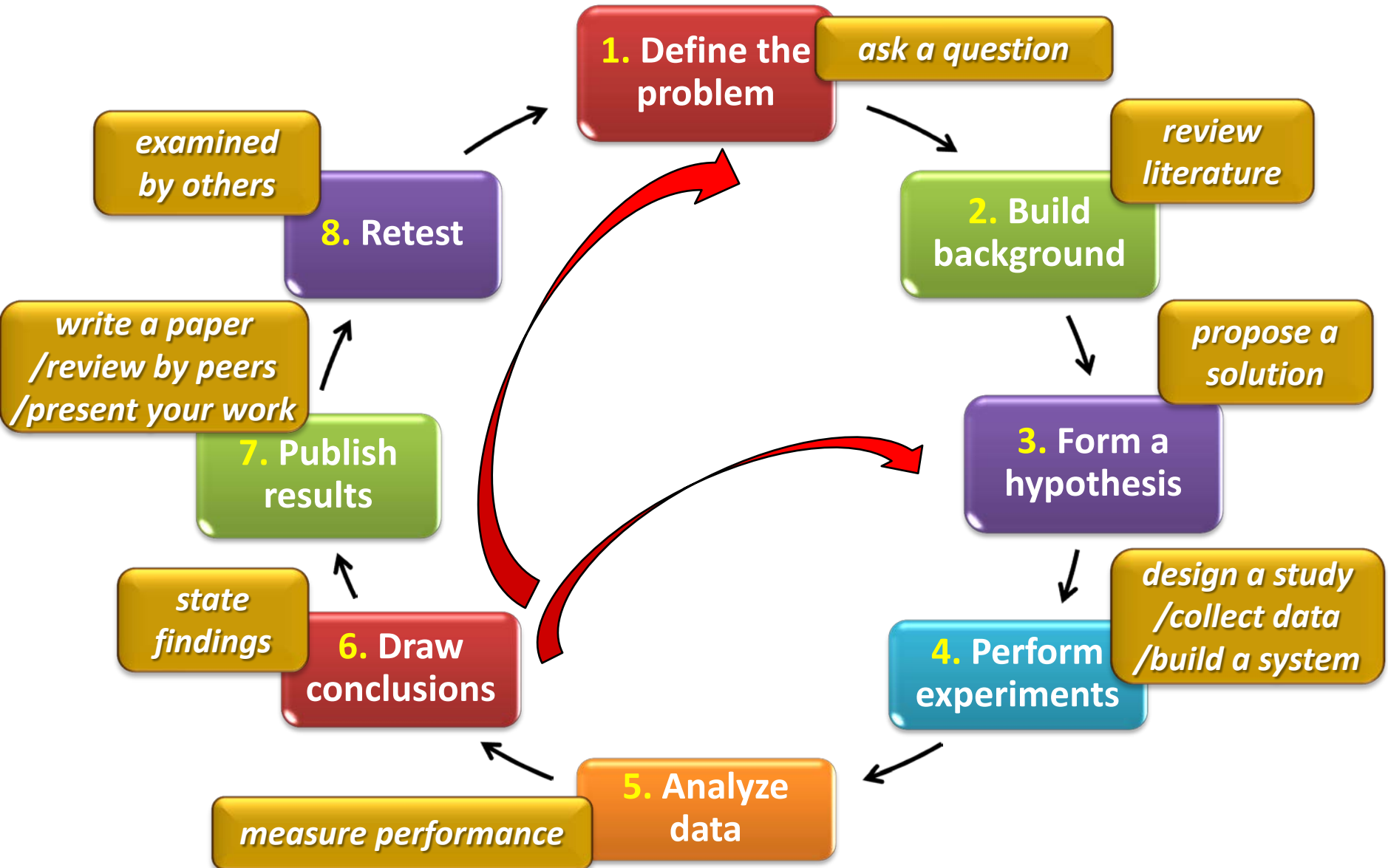

Research demands ...

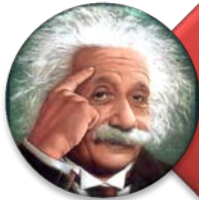
*a systematic investigation

“You should have a sense of *where you are going* before you start”



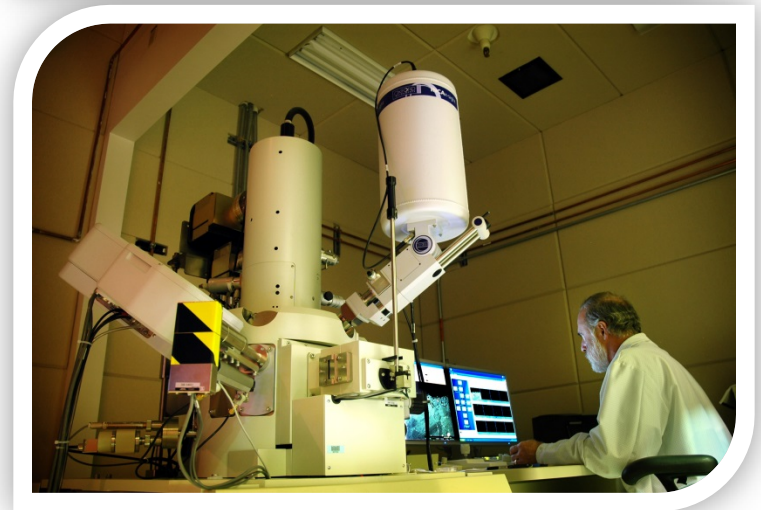
